

Attendance in School

We are aiming to achieve our 97% attendance target this term and look forward to all our children being in school and enjoying their learning, taking part in fun activities and enjoying being with their friends every day.

Research shows that low school attendance has an impact on learning, progress and attainment. It is so important that children attend school and not miss that vital learning.

During a full school year:

80% attendance=8 weeks of missed learning. 90% attendance=4 weeks of missed learning 95% attendance=2 weeks of missed learning.
