

Key Stage 2 spelling

Thank you for your support in helping your children to learn their weekly spellings.

We have used Twinkl spelling in Key Stage 2 for a few years, but this is the first year we have sent our class spelling patterns home to learn.

Before this year, we only sent key word spellings home, but we found that each child was working on a different booklet and so it was hard to reinforce the meaning of the words and spelling in school. Now, with a whole class approach, the children are learning the meaning of the words in context with their learning and using them in conversations and discussions. They talk about the spelling rules and, after they have practiced at home, they use them in sentences on their test day dictation activity. KS2 spellings build on from the phonics learnt in Key Stage 1 and it provides us with opportunities to address and teach any gaps in phonic knowledge.

We test 5 spellings each week, along with a spelling from the week before to help with memory and retention.

Thank you for helping your child to practise – your support makes such a difference to your child's learning.
