




Swimming








Good readers read like they are talking. They read nice and smooth, not bumpy or rough like

Phrasing





They STOP at periods, exclamation points, and auestions marks.

Intonation



Good readers change pitch and add emphasis to reflect end marks and important places in the sentences.

Volume and Stress



Good readers read LOUDER or SOFTER to reflect the different meanings in the story.



Good readers sound natural, like you're talking. We have expression when we use all the elements of fluency.
