It will often be muddy and/or wet and the children won't be able to access outdoor learning, if they haven't got their wellies/old trousers/waterproof.






When you listen to your child read at home, you can hear how well they are doing and help to improve their accuracy, fluency, phrasing and speed. It also fosters the love for reading and builds reading relationships, supporting that ability to talk about stories, characters. poems, interesting facts and favourite story moments.

Children who read at home for at least 10 minutes every day, make increased progress, because the more they practice, the better they get.
