



School Reports will be sent home with your child on Monday 14th July.

This report replaces our normal, face to face parents evening, if you would like to talk about the report, you are welcome to make an appointment with your child's teacher via Showbie.

### Guide to Attainment & Progress

Attainment means: the level at which your child is achieving in relation to the age-related expectations from the government.

1.4 is the expected level in Year 1 at the end of the year, 2.4 in year 2 etc. Some children may be achieving above this, some may be below, as all children learn in different ways, and sometimes at a different pace. Progress means: how far they have come since the start of the year. Children are expected to make 4/5 points progress in a school year, anything above that is good progress. Below 3 points is 'below expected' progress. Support is always put in place to help children who find some aspects of learning more difficult.
